# PART 1 - FEATURES

1. The platform is a “one-stop shop” for the AACB member central banks to store information on banking activities for the banking supervisors of the AACB /CABS.

# PART 1 - FEATURES

2. The platform allow group members to:

- ✓ post the completed information template bi-annually, within 60 days from the end of the reporting period i.e 30 june and 31 December. **This template is in Excel;**
- ✓ view and download published information;
- ✓ create static content for additional informational documents e.g training materials, meeting minutes etc.

# PART 1 - FEATURES


3. The platform provide a consolidated view that shows all submissions made per reporting period.
4. The member users receive email notification whenever a new content is uploaded or updated on the platform.

- 15 Central Banks nominated their officers who for data submissions
- The AACB Secretariat sent to the nominated officers their login credentials as well as the platform user manual. The submission of the data should start from the second semester of 2017
